# JD photography exhibit set Monday

A collection of photographs by Carlotta M. Corpron, former professor of design and creative photography at Texas Woman's University, will be exhibited by the University of Dallas Haggard Center Gallery Monday through Dec. 7.

The exhibit may be viewed daily from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Using photography as her medium, the artist has incorporated pure light sculpturally to create forms and spaces and to make designs that seem independent of any structural source.

The photography to be exhibited represents 10 years of intensive experimentation. They highlight interest in the abstract forms of nature such as flowers, shells and abstractions based on the reflections of light and eggs.

"My designs with light

were the natural result of having been both a design and creative photography teacher," says the artist. "I considered myself fortunate because my vocation and avocation merged."

Having spent 15 years of her childhood in India, where her father was a missionary surgeon, she was educated in the United States.

She taught design, advertising design, art history and creative photography at Texas Woman's University in Denton from 1935 until 1968.

Her photographs have been published in books by Kepes and Moholy-Nagy and have been exhibited in one-woman and group shows since 1944. Her work is included in collections at the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Art Institute in Chicago and the New Orleans Museum of Art.
