THE CONTROLLER'S OFFICE has issued new directions to be followed in making purchases and forwarding invoices. Because the University holds a "tax exempt" status, the exempt number should be used when making purchases for departments. Tax amounts should not be included on the Form 500 when it is forwarded to the Controller. When purchases are billed to departments, make sure the invoices are mailed to the attention of your department. If an invoice is mailed directly from the vendor to the Controller's Office, it will only delay payment since a Form 500 must be completed by the department prior to payment. Once the form has been filled out with all of the information that applies to the purchase (project number, total of accounts), it should be forwarded to Roxie Hart in the Business Office.
